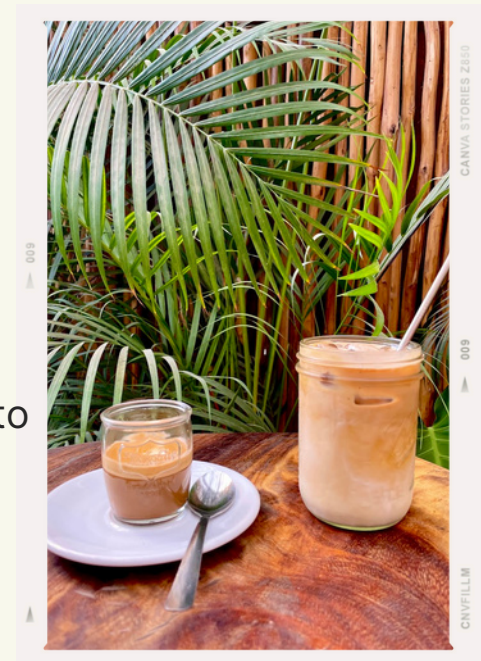

CENOTES! This is why people come to Tulum. This is for the water lovers, snorkers, and scuba divers! You will find yourself wanting to stay all day and noting the cenotes as THE highlight of your Tulum experience. With dozens to choose from, you will not be disappointed !



Our TOP Cenote was: Cenote Cristal y Escondido (2min drive from downtown). at \$15 a person this was the best value, you don't have to wear life jackets, you basically jump off of every corner that you can and it wasn't overly populated (but be sure to go as early as you can just in case)! You pay to visit 2 cenotes for the one price, go to the one where u buy your passes first & save the best for last (It is right across the street!)

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## Day 1: Travel Day



- 03:00 - 4:00pm Arrive in Cancun + go to customs
- 04:00 - 05:00pm Arrange Transport to Tulum (2hr drive)
- 05:00 - 6:00pm Arrive at accommodations
- 06:30 - 11:00pm Dinner near accommodations + explore Tulum town

## Day 2: Explore Tulum Towns



- 09:00 - 11:00am Breakfast + Coffee @Botanica Garden café
- 11:00 - 12:00pm Rent ATV/buggy (if you don't have a car)
- 12:00 - 03:00pm Explore Tulum Beach Town Shops + Find Raw Love cafe to cut through to the beach (treat yourself to a açaí bowl)
- 06:00 - 8:00 Dinner @ Antojitos la Chipaneca or find street tacos for local mexican cuisine. Grab dessert and explore the local markets

## Day 3: Tulum Ruins



- 08:00 - 09:00am Breakfast + Coffee @ Sin Etiqueta
- 09:00 - 11:00pm Visit the Tulum Ruins (Guided Tours)
- 11:30 - 03:00pm Lunch @ Tulum Beach + shop, beach, or walk around
- 16:00 - 11:00 Dinner + Margaristas @ Los Morros Callos & Aguachiles + walk around Tulum town & grab ice cream/dessert

- 07:30 - 8:00am Get snacks/drinks for cenote @ OXXO
- 08:00 - 8:30am Breakfast + coffee to go @Happy Coffee
- 08:30 - 02:00pm Go to Cenote Cristal y Escondido
- 02:00 - 03:00pm Grab street tacos for lunch + Rest/nap/or explore Tulum Town
- 09:00 - 11:00pm Dinner + drinks @ Tostada Tulum

- 08:00 - 05:00pm Catamaran to Isla Mujeres! A great day trip to visit this gorgeous neighboring island. Enjoy sailing, snorkeling, & white sandy beaches. ## Day 8-10 : Cancun Resort
